Mubin Shaikh is a former Muslim supremacist who deradicalized after studying Arabic in Islamic Studies in Damascus and was eventually recruited by the Canadian Security Intelligence Service as an undercover operative where he infiltrated extremist and terrorist cells. He was also extensively involved in anti-ISIS activities for coalition Special Operations Forces, including the weaponization of migration by ISIS and how it was exploited by anti-immigrant actors. Mubin is an Exit Peer Specialist with the renowned NGO, Parents for Peace, where he conducts interventions in extremism and terrorism cases and supports families and frontline responders working in law enforcement, education, health, and other areas.

Mubin Shaikh is a published author and appeared on CNN, CBC, ABC and NBC on matters related to extremism and terrorism. Among testifying in Canadian supreme courts, he's also testified as an expert for the United Nations Security Council, the U.S. Senate Committee on Homeland Security, NATO, the National Counterterrorism Center and Special Operations Command Central.
